J.A.S.P.

WHAT IS THE JUNIOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS PROGRAM?

J.A.S.P. is an educational program that utilizes EMPOWER, a long-standing, evidenced-based reading intervention program with the intent to:

- provide differentiated instructional methods:
- remediate basic academic skill development;
- diminish students' learning gaps in the areas of literacy and numeracy;
- build student self-esteem and self advocacy skills;
- develop independence, organizational strategies; and,
- use assistive technology to assist students in meeting with success across the curriculum.

HOW DOES J.A.S.P. WORK?

Placement in the J.A..S.P. is for one school year.

Students are in a JASP classroom where they are taught all subjects and are withdrawn for reading intervention only for one hour daily.

The reading remediation is delivered in small groups (8-10 students), in a **quiet classroom** free from noise and distraction.

Technology is a vital component to the J.A.S.P. Students receive in class training with the technology.

Each student is provided with a SEA Claim iPad.

CONSIDERATION FOR PLACEMENT IN THE J.A.S.P.

The Student:

- Is presently or will be in the Junior Division;
- has received a psycho-educational assessment which indicates that the student has a Learning Disability in reading decoding (reading should be at least 2 years behind current grade level);
- has at least average general intellectual abilities; and,
- does not present with disruptive or disengaging behavior that negatively affects his/her success or other students' success in the program.

The School and Parent/Guardian:

- Parent/guardian provides medical documentation concerning the student's current health status (e.g., allergies, medications, hearing/vision checks).
- If J.A.S.P. is recommended then parents/ guardians are invited to visit the J.A.S.P. site.
- If parents agree to the program, then the Principal and SERT are to complete the **J.A.S.P. application package.**

PRESENTATION TO THE SYSTEM IPRC

The System IPRC is a committee which reviews the information gathered by the school.

The System IPRC determines the students Identification and placement.

PLACEMENT IN THE J.A.S.P.

Placement in the JASP is for <u>one</u> school year.

The student needs to be **registered** at St. Anthony Daniel CES for the full school year.

Student's placement is **reviewed** by the System IPRC within the year.

Transportation to the JASP and home is provided by the School Board.
